

University Scholarships in Gaza



Students supported through FHL's Gaza's university Scholarship programme

The situation

No bigger than the Isle of Wight and home to almost 2 million people, Gaza is the most densely populated country in the world. The Christian community is tiny, numbered at approximately 1,000, and is at risk of disappearing altogether without sustainable investment in the next generation. Life in Gaza is unimaginably hard. Cut off from Israel by a 1km 'no go zone' the population are reliant on international food aid, have no access to clean tap water and have electricity for just a few hours a day. Prospects for young people are bleak, with 65% unemployed.

How does FHL help?

Since 2015 FHL have provided £10,000 worth of funding each year in support of this project, enabling 10 students to study university courses in Gaza.

What impact does FHL make?

Student life is difficult – our students find coursework enjoyable, but daily commutes, electricity cuts and other social problems make completing degree courses very challenging. Without the support of FHL it is likely these young people would quit their courses and consider emigration. Instead, they are striving to equip themselves to help shape and lead their community in the future.
